Tree Descriptions & Site Suitability		75% to 80% Survival Rate – All trees & shrubs sold are to be used for effective conservation practices such as windbreaks, erosion control, etc., and will not be planted for ornamental purposes. Species	Mature Height	Description	Soil	Light
AMERICAN CRABAPPLE	15-35'	Small spreading tree with broad, often multi-trunked crown. Known for its fragrant pink-to-white spring blossoms and small yellowish fruits. Offers beauty and wildlife benefits.	Moist, Well-drained	Prefers Sun
AMERICAN PLUM	10-20'	A small tree what is native throughout much of the central US. Produces 1" reddish-purple plums. Important pollinator and wildlife food source.	Clay, loamy, moist, well-drained, slightly acidic.	Full sun is ideal, or partial to full shade
BALSAM FIR	45-75'	Native Evergreen, well-adapted to cold climates. Symmetrical, dark green color, spicy fragrance. Great wildlife species for food and shelter; Christmas tree or windbreak.	Moist, well-drained soil. Acidic	Full sun to partial shade
BAYBERRY, NORTHERN	5-6'	Deciduous shrub, upright and spreading branches, leaves turn bronze-tan and then fall off, produces small BB-sized waxy berries, good for soil stabilization	Dry sandy soils, prefer acidic soils, tolerant of salt spray	Full sun to partial shade but full sun is best
BLACK WILLOW	30-60'	Grows along the water, one of the greatest benefits of willows is a soil-binder. Provides honeybees with nectar and pollen.	Tolerates dry soil	Shade
BUTTON BUSH	3-6'	Deciduous shrub, rounded and spreading shape, late to leaf out in spring, turns from dark green to greenish yellow-yellow, flowers are creamy white and fragrant, bloom is June, July, August, fruit persists through winter good for habitat	Moist soils	Full sun, light shade
CANAAN FIR	50'	Dark to bluish dark green needles, undersides of needles have two white stripes, similar to Fraser Fir with more branches. Used as Christmas Tree	Moist soils	Full sun to partial shade
CHOKO CHERRY	20-30'	Used in landscaping provides fragrant spring flowers, wildlife value and edible fruit. It produces white flowers and dark green leaves.	Adaptable soil types	Full sun to partial shade
COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE	50-75'	Produces a unique silvery blue-green color, can be a windbreak, excellent Christmas tree and wildlife habitat	Adapts to many soil types - normal moisture.	Full sun is ideal
FRASER FIR	30-55'	Produces fragrant and long-lasting needles, excellent Christmas tree with long needle retention and strong branches.	Moist, well-drained, acidic soil	Full sun to partial shade
HIGHBUSH BLUBERRY	6-12'	Mid-season, extra-large berries that are sweet. Cold hardy Mid-season, high yields, good disease resistance, extremely hardy.	Moist, well-drained soils	Full sun to partial shade
HIGHBUSH CRANBERRY	8-15'	Fruit resembles a cranberry; they soften and sweeten over winter and are eaten by Cedar Waxwing and other birds. Large hardy shrub.	Clay, loam, sand, moist soils	Full sun to partial shade
NORWAY SPRUCE	40-60'	Fastest growing of the spruces. Develops strong graceful branches covered in dark green needles. Ideal windbreak or wildlife shelter.	Acidic, loamy, well-drained soils.	Full sun
PAWPAW	15'	Native fruit bearing trees, often found in moist places, steep hillsides and creek banks. Large tropical looking foliage produces fruit. Excellent wildlife tree.	Moist, rich soil	Full sun to partial shade
REDBUD	20-30'	A bold landscape statement. An excellent wildlife species, especially for pollinators. Produces blooms of rosy, pink flowers in April.	Acidic, alkaline, rich, sandy, well-drained, clay	Full sun to partial shade
RED CHOKEBERRY	6-12'	Multi-stemmed shrub, white spring flowers and glossy green summer leaves, red fall foliage. Great for rain gardens and borders. Excellent for birds and pollinators.	Adaptable soil - wet, dry, clay	Full sun to partial shade
RED MAPLE	60'	Fast growing. In fall the leaf color will range from green to flaming orange.	Tolerant of wide range of soil, prefers slightly acid soils	Full sun
STRAWBERRY	3-5"	The Albion strawberry continuously produces sweet berries all summer long. Great for ground cover and birds, with a tasty treat just for you!	Well-drained soil	Full sun
SUGAR MAPLE	75-100'	Deciduous, perfect for a shade tree, beautiful fall colors, yellowish green flowers before leaves in April, sugar rich sap for maple syrup	Well drained moist fertile soil, does not like root constriction	Full sun preferred but can handle shade
SWAMP WHITE OAK	50-60'	Deciduous, 50-60' wide, red fall color, blooms in May, acorns attract wildlife	Acidic, wet soils	Part shade, full shade
TULIP POPLAR	70-120'	All around visually pleasing trees that produce greenish yellow to orange colored tulip-like flowers. Fast growing trees that can reach immense sizes	Deep, moist, rich soils	Full sun
RUSSELL LUPINE SEED PACKET	Packet contains multi-colored perennial lupine. Prefers fertile well drained soil, and sun to light shade. Grows up to a height of 4 ft. Approximately 75 seeds per packet, covers a small area.			
SULFUR	Soil amendment for Blueberries and other acid loving plants. Sulfur helps to lower the pH of the soil for plants that require highly acid soils (pH range of 4.5 to 5.5); such as blueberries, azaleas & rhododendrons.			
FERTILIZER TABLETS	Use 1 tablet per 1/4" stem diameter. One tablet for seedlings, two for transplants.
